### **Localização**

### **Nova Iorque**

Nova Iorque é uma das mais emocionantes e dinâmicas cidades do mundo. Diz-se com frequência que é 'a cidade que nunca dorme'! É famosa pela sua oferta cultural, pela variedade de opções de entretenimento que oferece, com museus, teatros, restaurantes, bares e também pela possibilidade de boas compras.

### **Colégio**

### **RIDER UNIVERSITY**

O *campus* da Rider University situa-se a cerca de hora e meia de Nova Iorque e oferece excelentes condições para a realização de um curso de verão numa atmosfera verdadeiramente internacional. Lawrenceville e Princeton são as cidades mais próximas, a cerca de 3 km de distância, e com ligação de autocarro à saída da universidade. Rodeado por extensos campos relvados, este *campus* dispõe de excelentes infra-estruturas que possibilitam a prática de diversos desportos, como o centro de *fitness*, pistas de atletismo, *courts* de ténis, piscina e vários campos de jogos. Dentro do espaço da Rider University os alunos dispõem ainda de banco, lavandaria, sala de computadores, centro médico e segurança 24 horas por dia.

Para alojamento dos alunos este espaçoso *campus* tem quatro residências próprias, nas quais os jovens ficam instalados, em quartos individuais ou duplos, com casas de banho a partilhar. As residências possuem também salas comuns muito confortáveis, com televisão e DVD, onde os alunos poderão conviver ao final do dia. No refeitório principal serão servidas todas as refeições diárias, à excepção dos dias em que os alunos saem em excursão.

### **Programa**

### **Educacional / Desportivo / Cultural**

Parte importante do programa é composto pelas aulas de Língua Inglesa, que decorrem durante as manhãs, num total de 20 lições por semana, em turmas multinacionais. No restante tempo livre é programado pela *Plus - Study Tours* um completo programa social e cultural. Aproveitando a proximidade à cidade de Nova Iorque, haverá oportunidade de visitar aquela que é mais conhecida por '*Big Apple*'. Em duas semanas de estadia estão previstas cinco deslocações a Manhattan, visitando locais emblemáticos como Central Park e Strawberry Fields; Fifth Avenue; Times Square e Top of the Rock; Chelsea District; Statue of Liberty e Ellis Island; Ground Zero; Metropolitan Museum of Art, etc. São ainda planeadas idas à Broadway, jantares no Hard Rock Café e *tours 'New York by Night'*. No programa está ainda incluído uma visita às cidades de Filadélfia e de Baltimore e um fim-de-semana em Washington.

## ABOUT THE CENTRE

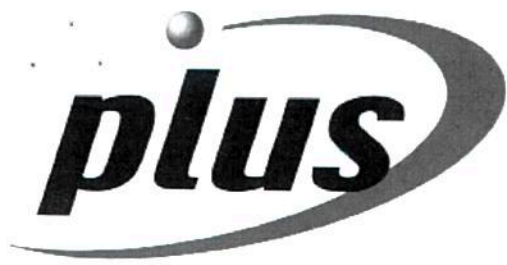
Rider University, located in Lawrenceville, New Jersey is comfortably situated within easy driving distances to both New York and Philadelphia. The nearest airports are Philadelphia International Airport, Newark Liberty International Airport, and JFK International Airport.

## CAMPUS

Rider University features two campuses. The 280-acre main campus in Lawrenceville is host to forty-one buildings, athletic fields, tennis courts, indoor swimming pool, and lake. The 23-acre Westminster campus holds thirteen buildings and is located in Princeton, NJ. The accommodation Halls are conveniently located on campus and easily accessible to classrooms, dining facilities, and other campus amenities.

## ACCOMMODATION

Students will stay in one of the following accommodations:

En suite accommodation:

### New Building

It features two people suites and four people private bedroom suites. They included a common area with living room furniture. Some suites feature kitchenettes.

### West Village

It features four private bedroom suites, three private bedroom suites and two person suites. They include a common area with living room furniture. Some feature kitchenettes.

Non-en suite:

### Ziegler and Hills Halls

Single/ double occupancy rooms with communal bathroom in corridors. Ratio of four students to one bathroom

## CENTER FACILITIES

### Classrooms

Lessons are held on campus in academic buildings equipped with modern technology.

### Cafeteria

Dining at Rider is located in Daly's Dining Hall and students can enjoy a wide variety of menu selections ranging from vegetarian to meat entrées, fruits and desserts in a buffet style setting. Special arrangements are available for both medical and/or religious dietary restrictions.

### Laundry Facilities

Laundry machines are provided free of charge, but participants must supply detergent.

### Lounges

A big-screen television, billiards, and table tennis are located in the lounges of your Residence Hall to use at your leisure until curfew.

### Computers

Group participants will have scheduled access to a computer lab for purposes of sending and receiving e-mail and skyping.

### ATM Machines

There are three Automated Teller Machines which are located throughout the Rider's Campus

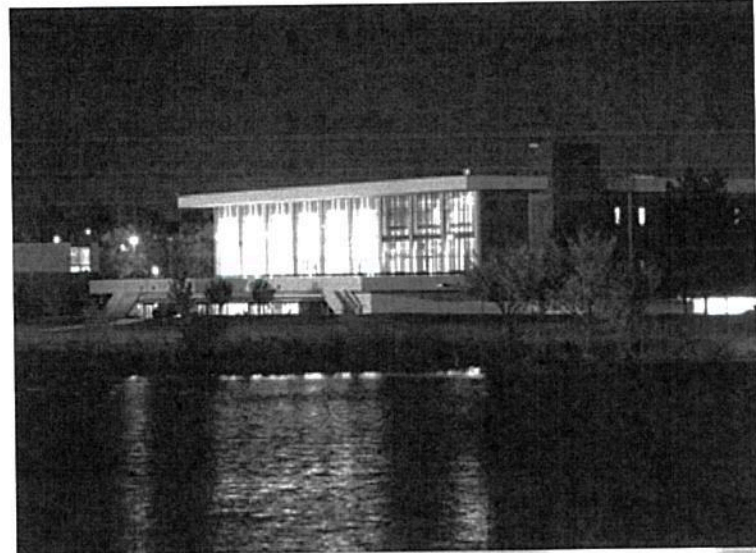

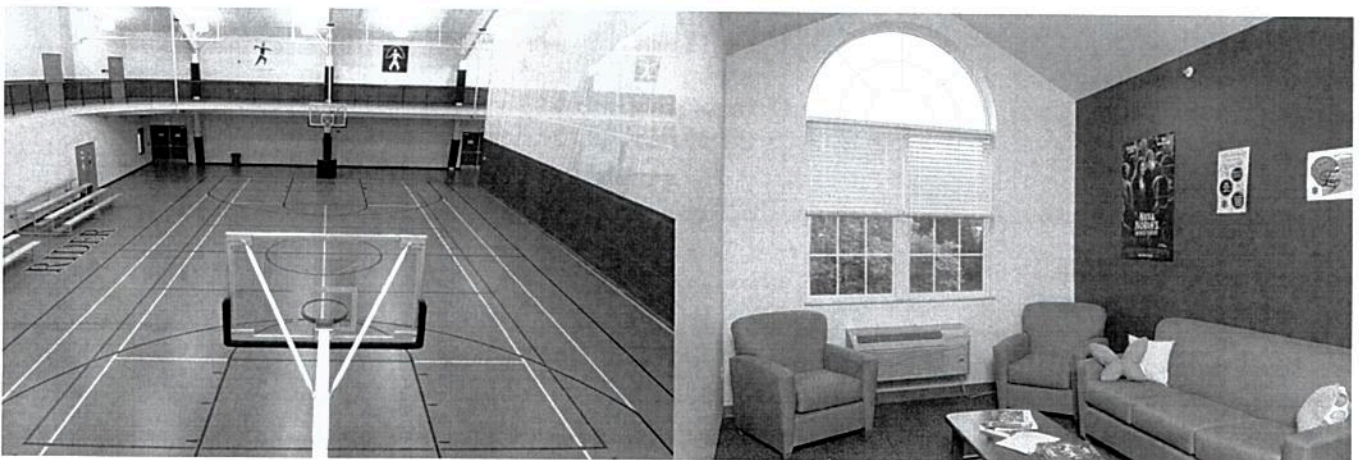

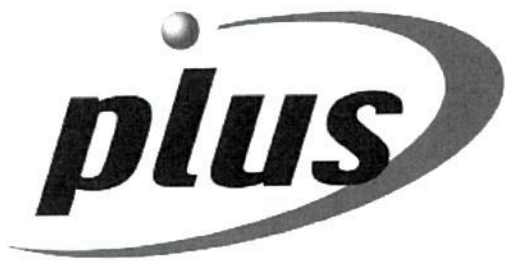

MEAL PLAN

Students eat buffet style in the Daly Dining Hall. Meals are varied, and it is possible to accommodate dietary and religious restrictions.

**BREAKFAST:** Breakfast includes hot buffet variety, assorted cereals, fruit, coffee, tea, and juice.

**LUNCH:** Lunch includes hot and cold buffet variety, sandwich options, a salad bar, a dessert bar, and soda and juice.

**DINNER:** Dinner includes several hot and cold buffet varieties, a salad bar, a dessert bar, coffee, tea, juice, and soda.

## LIVING ON CAMPUS

### **Linens**

Participants will each be given a set of linens to include the following and will be changed weekly:

- 1 Set of Flat sheets
- 1 Blanket
- 1 Pillow and case
- 2 Bath Towels
- 1 Washcloth

### **Room Cleaning**

Common areas of rooms will be cleaned three times a week (i.e. bathrooms, kitchens and sitting areas) Common areas in the Residence Halls will be cleaned daily (i.e. lobby, lounges, and hallways). For security and privacy, cleaning staff will never enter or clean bedrooms.

\*All personal items should be kept in locked bedrooms.

### **Laundry Facilities**

Washers and dryers are located in each Residence Hall and are operated free of charge. Detergent and dryer sheets will NOT be provided, but can be purchased on campus in the C3 Convenience Store.

### **Vending Machines**

Bottled sodas, water and snacks may be purchased through the vending machines located in the lobby of your Residence Hall and throughout campus. (These machines accept US\$1.00 bills and quarters only)

### **C<sup>3</sup> Convenience Store**

Located in Daly Dining Hall this store be open daily to provide any of the essentials forgotten or desired. Snacks, soda, candy, toiletries, batteries, medicine and international calling cards are among the items available for purchase.

### **Rules and Regulations**

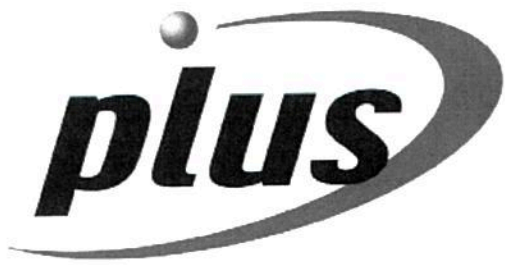
Students must obey all written and verbal rules from Study Tours/ PLUS Counselors. All Pitzer rules and American Laws must be followed and will be enforced. Curfew for all participants will be Midnight (12:00 a.m.) unless otherwise stated. Counselors will report violations and make recommendations of consequences to the Study Tours/ PLUS Site Coordinator.

### **Safety Deposit Box**

A safety deposit box is available on campus.

### **Fire**

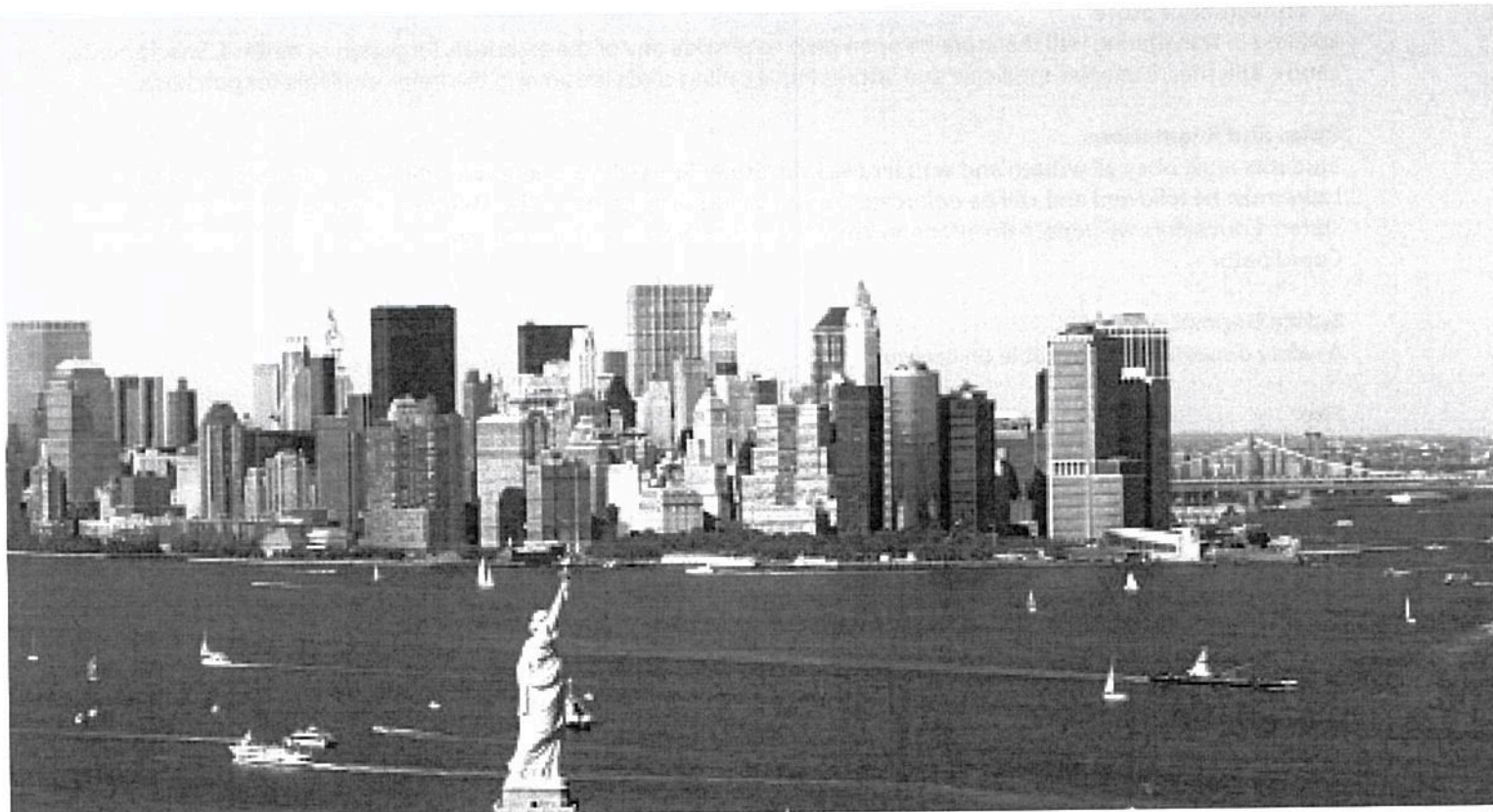

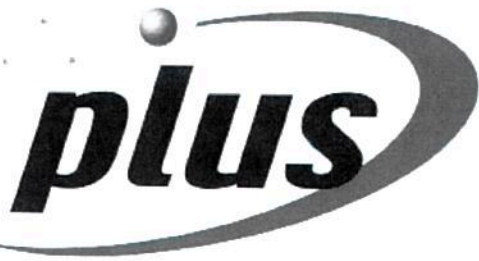
## **Damages**

Damages made must be paid for. All rooms and common areas are regularly checked for damages, and individuals who cause damage to any property on the site will be held liable for the cost of repairs. Refundable deposits of \$25 are collected from all students for damages on arrival at the site. This money will be returned at the end of the stay provided there are no damages to the site. The cost of damage in communal areas that is not caused by a particular student or groups of students will be equally divided among all students residing in that particular area. A \$25 fee is charged for every lost key.

## **International Calls**

International calls require the use of an international calling card or the use of 9-1-800-COLLECT. To obtain an outside line for an international call you must first dial 9, then follow the directions on the back of your international calling card (the code to dial outside the United States is 011). Each site also has computers available for students to call via skype. Skype calls are the cheapest method of international calling.

## MEDICAL INFORMATION

If a student is sick or there is a medical emergency, please immediately seek medical care. Students should contact their group leader. If necessary, students will be taken to Capital Health System (Fuld Campus) which will need to be paid for by the student (including transportation). Students are usually taken to the emergency room for care.

## LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

### By Rail

Trenton Train Station is a ten minute taxi ride from campus and has a regular train service to New York and Philadelphia.

### By Bus

Local buses can take groups into Princeton or the Quakerbridge Mall on additional excursions.
